Hay was a source of stress for many as the over abundance of rain caused hay production to be less than desirable. The hay we did get was nutritious, most farms just didn't get enough. The show circuit was fantastic and we watched many Cotswolds here in the Northeast do extremely well in the show ring. The All American , Northeast Youth and Big E shows in Springfield, MA gave Cotswolds a platform to show off the breed. Our local Saratoga Fair saw over 40 Cotswolds walk thru the show ring and capture some great awards. Cotswold is the featured breed for the Maryland Sheep & Wool which is being held the beginning of May. Way to go Cotswolds!
